6.4.2 Qualitative research approach Qualitative methods are designed to explore the human factor and cause-and-effect nuances. Qualitative research is best suited to accommodating factors that cannot be translated into number-based results. The results of qualitative research are influenced by interaction between the researcher and the subject.

Qualitative Research. The purpose of qualitative research is to gather non-numerical data to help explain or develop a theory about a relationship. Methods used to gain qualitative information include surveys, observation, case studies, and interviews and the information derived from these means can be combined into a story like description of what is happening or what has happened in the past.
