Test Validity and Reliability. Whenever a test or other measuring device is used as part of the data collection process, the validity and reliability of that test is important. Just as we would not use a math test to assess verbal skills, we would not want to use a measuring device for research that was not truly measuring what we purport it to measure.

Understanding of the importance of reliability and ...

Reliability refers to the extent that the instrument yields the same results over multiple trials. Validity refers to the extent that the instrument measures what it was designed to measure. In research, there are three ways to approach validity and they include content validity, construct validity, and criterion-related validity.
