The Treaties of the European Union are a set of international treaties between the European Union (EU) member states which sets out the EU's constitutional basis. They establish the various EU institutions together with their remit, procedures and objectives. The EU can only act within the competences granted to it through these treaties and amendment to the treaties requires the agreement and ratification (according to their national procedures) of every single signatory.

Since December 2009, after the Lisbon Treaty came into force, the European Union is considered to have three legislative bodies: the European Commission, the Council of the European Union and the European Parliament, with the national parliaments of the EU playing a further role.

EU Secondary Law. In the EU, secondary legislation arises entirely subject to the authority, higher rank, and procedures provided for in the Treaties. Article 288 TFEU provides the means by which the Union institutions are able to enact secondary legislation, which are also a binding source of law for the member states.
