Branches of the U.S. Government | USAGov

The U.S. Constitution establishes a government based on "federalism." This is the sharing of power between the national and state (as well as local) governments. This power-sharing form of government is the opposite of "centralized" governments, under which a national government maintains total power.

The Basic Structure of the U.S. Federal Government

The President of the United States is the elected leader of the country. As the head of state, the president is the leader of the federal government, and Commander in Chief of the United States Armed Forces. Elected according to the Electoral College process, the president serves a four-year term and is limited to serving no more than two terms.

Introduction to the Structure of U.S. Government

The United States government is best categorized as a constitutional federal republic. This means that the United States is governed primarily by elected representatives and an elected leader, and that power is balanced between the federal government and the governments of the states. If a government is constitutional, that means that it relies on a constitution that describes the distribution of political power within that government.
