The word journalism applies to the occupation, as well as citizen journalists who gather and publish unbiased information based on facts and supported with proofs or evidences.

As well as a dozen stories—from “ In the Town of Berdichev ” (Grossman ’ s first published success) to “ In Kislovodsk ” (the last story he wrote)—this volume includes an unusual article about the life of a Moscow cemetery. It also contains two letters Grossman wrote to his mother, after her death at the hands of the Nazis, and the complete text of “ The Hell of Treblinka, ” one of the very first, and still among the most powerful, accounts of a Nazi death camp.
