Behaviour: Overall, the evidence makes it clear that reducing challenging behaviour in schools can have a direct and lasting effect on pupils' learning. However, school leaders should be aware that some interventions can be effective in reducing problematic behaviour without improving attainment. Three broad categories of behaviour interventions can be identified: Universal programmes which seek to improve engagement and behaviour, and generally take place in the classroom;
