Clinical Practice Guidelines. “Clinical practice guidelines are systematically developed statements to assist practitioner and patient decisions about appropriate health care for specific clinical circumstances.” (Institute of Medicine, 1990) Issued by third-party organizations, and not NCCH, these guidelines define the role of specific diagnostic and treatment modalities in the diagnosis and management of patients.

Scope of practice defined in nursing. The Nursing Scope and Standards of Practice describe the “who,” “what,” “where,” “when,” “why,” and “how” of nursing practice: Who: Registered Nurses (RN) and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRN) comprise the “who” constituency and have been educated, titled, and maintain active licensure to practice nursing.

Registered practitioners are also accountable to regulatory bodies in terms of standards of practice and patient care. Registered nurses and midwives are professionally accountable to the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC). The law imposes a duty of care on practitioners, whether they are HCAs, APs, students, registered nurses, doctors or others.
